Bugs arrive in the Bay

THE early stages of a national whooping cough outbreak and the ongoing large outbreak of mumps in Auckland have prompted medical officials to urge parents immunise.

Medical officer of health Jim Miller has reminded Eastern Bay residents to check that their immunisations are up to date. With the holiday season almost here, spreading disease becomes more of a risk with travel and increased physical contact.

"It's important residents in Bay of Plenty and Lakes check with their family doctor to see that they, and their whanau, are up to date with their immunisations," he said.

Since the start of this year, there

have been 120 cases of whooping cough notified to authorities.

"Of these, 82 cases have been in the Bay of Plenty, and 38 have been in the Lakes region.

Whooping cough is a highly infectious and distressing illness caused by bacteria that is spread by coughing and sneezing, said Dr Miller.

"Symptoms start with a runny nose, fever and dry cough. Coughing gets worse over the next few weeks, developing into attacks of coughing and sometimes vomiting."

Babies under one year are most at risk of serious complications from whooping cough.

The best way to protect babies is for their mother to be immunised during pregnancy (between 28 and 38 weeks) so that anti-

bodies are passed on to the baby. These antibodies will help reduce the likelihood of the baby becoming ill with whooping cough before their first immunisation at six weeks.

In addition to the national rise in whooping cough cases, mumps is also more common this year. Since September 2016 there have been more than 1000 cases of mumps reported in New Zealand.

While most of these cases have been in the Auckland region, holiday travel increases the likelihood of mumps spreading to other parts of the country.

Mumps is highly infectious, and spread by coughing and sneezing, or through contact with infected saliva. Symptoms appear about two to three weeks after contracting mumps.

APPOINTMENT OF ADVISORY TRUSTEES TO FISHERIES TRUST
NOTICE TO HAPŪ INVITING NOMINATIONS

Pursuant to Sec 3.1 of the Whakatōhea Fisheries Trust Constitution, any adult member of Whakatōhea may be appointed as an Advisory Trustee for a hapū of Whakatōhea in which that person is listed as a member in the Whakatōhea Māori Trust Board Register.

The Board shall not appoint any person if she or he:

- (a) is or becomes a person in respect of whose affairs an order under the Protection of Personal Property Rights Act 1988 is made, or otherwise becomes unfit or unable to act as an Advisory Trustee; or
- (b) commits an act of bankruptcy or is an undischarged bankrupt; or
- (c) is or has ever been convicted of an offence involving dishonesty as defined in section 2(1) of the Crimes Act 1961, or an offence under section 373(4) of the Companies Act 1993.

Term

The term of an Advisory Trustee shall be three years.
